

Call for Bids to Organize & Host the 17th IAFSS Symposium, Asia-Oceania Region, 2032

The IAFSS Trustees and MAC welcome bids for the 17th IAFSS Symposium, to be hosted in the Asia-Oceania region in 2032. Selection of the host for the symposium will be made during the 15th IAFSS Symposium to be held in La Rochelle, France, **7 – 12 June 2026**. If you are interested in hosting the 17th IAFSS Symposium, we kindly ask that you:

- (a) make your interest known (intent to submit a bid) no later than 27 February 2026, and**
- (b) submit your formal bid no later than 1 May 2026.**

Considerations for host selection will include:

BACK-UP and SUPPORT

- Institutional / departmental commitment and adequate department staffing to support event
- Commitment to abide by IAFSS policies on DEI and Safeguarding
- Commitment of local/national fire community to hosting symposium
- National and local sponsorship opportunities
- Local meeting planning and execution staff (either in-house or external agency)
- Website development and online registration capabilities
- Active participation in Symposium Committee meetings.
- Ability to organise a virtual or hybrid symposium.

SYMPOSIUM FACILITIES REQUIREMENTS

- If in-person or hybrid,
 - Options should be provided for (a) hybrid as a backup to in-person, if needed, and (b) hybrid meaning an on-line option concurrent with the in-person option (i.e., ‘true’ hybrid event).
- Adequate IT facilities and capacity, including reliable Wi-Fi or other institutional internet access
- Adequate, accessible, meeting facilities / on-line capacity (up to 500 attendees in-person, 500-700 online) with large plenary space and 3 session spaces, two poster sessions (at least 60 posters each), preferable all in one building (in person). Catering facilities nearby (e.g., 2-4 minutes) walk for lunch.
- Adequate number of accessible sleeping rooms in close proximity (i.e., ideally walking distance or with dedicated buses or similar transportation option) is desired. A mix of quality (i.e. 2-4*star) hotel and other accommodations, including student housing opportunities, should be available.
- Ease of international travel (e.g., flights, rail) and local transportation to venue and accommodation.
- Social program opportunities (welcome reception, night out, and symposium banquet inclusive, as well as providing optional social opportunities for evenings).
- Partner program opportunities.
- Virtual/hybrid alternatives to be listed and explained (i.e., approach, technology capabilities, etc.)

The Local Host Organization is **not** responsible for the content of the technical program, poster program, or workshops. The Program Committee makes the decisions on the program and the Symposium Planning Committee makes decisions on the content of the overall symposium. Cooperation between both committees is a crucial component for the success of the symposium. The Local Host Committee **does** have a critical role in the finances of the symposium. A financial agreement is made with IAFSS before the organization of the conference. A draft agreement will be prepared by IAFSS, for discussion and concurrence with the local hosts / organizers, to ensure that IAFSS rules are followed (e.g. for DEI, Code of Conduct, etc.) and that the financial terms are clear. A minimum expectation is that the symposium is self-supporting. However, the symposium has historically been an important source of revenue for IAFSS, and bidders/organisers should be aware that the generated revenue in excess of costs is to be forwarded to IAFSS.

The timeline and selection process is as follows:

- Bidders are to submit a written (email) **intent to submit** a formal bid to the IAFSS Secretariat (secretariat@iafss.org), no later than **27 February 2026**.
- IAFSS will provide the draft operational and financial agreement document to bidders by **17 March 2026**.
- Bidders are to submit written details of their **formal bid** to the IAFSS Secretariat (secretariat@iafss.org), **no later than 1 May 2026**.
- Bidders are asked to prepare a **pre-recorded presentation, maximum 20 minutes**, and send to the Honorary Secretary **no later than 30 May 2026**. The IAFSS Honorary Secretary will be in contact regarding acceptable format and email address / file transfer location.
- Bidders will be able to **defend their bid** to the IAFSS Trustees and Membership Advisory Committee (MAC) during the 15th Symposium in La Rochelle. This is anticipated to be during their meeting during the symposium (exact date and time to be provided to bidders in late May). This meeting will provide opportunities for questions and discussion with the Trustees and MAC members. The time allotted for discussion will depend on whether the meeting is in-person or virtual (in-person is planned at this time).
- **A decision will be made by the IAFSS Trustees and MAC at this meeting.**
- **Bids arriving after 27 February 2026, or incomplete bids, will not be considered.**

For reference and guidance, I have attached to this letter a copy of the material provided by the Universidad Tecnica Federico Santa Maria and partners in their successful bid for the IAFSS 16th Symposium to be held in 2029, which they have graciously allowed us to share.

Why Chile?



Economic and Political Stability

Chile has an open economy, with clear and consistent regulations, which have allowed, over time, for balanced and sustainable growth. In a report by The Economist Intelligence Unit, Chile was named as the best country across the region within which to do business and was ranked 17th globally. Chile stands out from the rest of the countries in Latin America because of the effective nature of its policy making, its market opportunities, its employment, and its infrastructure. It is also one of the most popular countries when it comes to attracting foreign investment.



Sustainability



Chile was ranked first in Latin America in the 2020 Sustainable Development ranking, work carried out by economist Jeffrey Sachs and published by the University of Cambridge, which analyzes the progress of countries regarding the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) of the 2030 Agenda established by the UN.

Chile achieved a total score of 77.4, surpassing the regional average. In Latin America, behind our country, were Costa Rica (75.1 points), Uruguay (74.3 points) and Ecuador (74.3 points).

The five best average performances in the country were achieved in SDGs 1, 4, 6, 7 and 13, the last three being (SDG 6 “clean water and sanitation”, SDG 7 “affordable and clean energy” and SDG 13 “action for the climate”) strongly related to the environmental dimension. *

The public and private sectors of the Chilean tourism industry work hard for the development of sustainable tourism, through the promotion and adoption of practices that are friendly to the environment. Through the progress of sustainable tourism, the conservation of the country's natural and cultural heritage is achieved, while allowing tourist destinations to achieve sustainable economic development over time, benefiting the communities that inhabit them.

Chile is internationally recognized for its outstanding developments in the areas of architecture, design, and industry infrastructure relating to roads and housing. Projects are located across the country in some of the most diverse geographical conditions.


It also provides first-class facilities for the purpose of hosting tourism events and other business-related conventions.

Gastronomy Unique

Chilean cuisine is a rich mixture of old traditions and ingredients, first introduced by the country's indigenous groups, which have been influenced by European preparation techniques and styles.

The country's extensive Pacific coastline provides a constant supply of one of its greatest culinary treasures: seafood! A good Chilean meal is never com-

plete without a glass of Chilean wine.

The cochayuyo is an edible seaweed rich in iodine which lives on the coast of sub Antarctic seas. It has been extracted from the Chilean coasts for centuries and valued for its low weight packaging for consumption and commercial interchange. The Mapuche communities have incorporated it into their own culinary tradition in their stews, pebre salsas, soups, salads, and jams. They also draw on this rich ingredient in many Creole recipes.



In an effort to advance the development of the South American fire community, the Chilean Section of The Combustion Institute and Brazil's Rede Nacional de Combustão are working to increase the number of scientific meetings held in the region. This joint effort comes from the recognition that our current situation demands more participation in the international arena to promote the visibility of the research carried out in South America. The team bidding to host the 16th IAFSS Symposium, Americas, 2029 to be held in Chile is made up of academic scientists from Chile and Brazil. The next sections describe the organizations participating in this bid. To guarantee the success of the symposium, the local organizing committee will work directly with a Chilean external agency with a good track record in the organization of scientific meetings.




Chilean Section of the Combustion Institute

Founded in August 2016, the main purpose of the Chilean Section of The Combustion Institute is to promote combustion science and its application to different problems for the general benefit of society. The Chilean Section is composed of a total of 48 active members, 22 students and 26 non-student members. To date, the members of the Chilean Section have had a very active participation in multiple activities in the fire safety community. Relevant for this bid is the role of the Chilean Section and its members in the organization of the 1eres Journées Franco AMSUD, which took place in Marseille during March 2019, and the upcoming 2emes Journées Franco AMSUD, which that will take place in Viña del Mar in 2025. Also relevant is the organization of the 1st and 2nd versions of the Asia-Pacific Combustion Institute Summer School (APCISS) that took place in the cities of Viña del Mar in 2019 and Valparaiso in 2022. These schools gathered close to 100 people to study fundamental combustion problems applied to fire. Finally, the Chilean team has also had an active participation in the IAFSS activities, including publications in Fire Safety Journal, participation in the IAFSS Symposium, and participation in different IAFSS committees.



Rede Nacional de Combustão

The Rede Nacional de Combustão (RNC) is a Brazilian group founded on February 2002 by Brazilian combustion researchers with the objective to become a reference for combustion science in the country and make substantial contributions to overcoming scientific, technological, industrial, social and strategic problems in the field of Combustion and in related sectors. With over 60 academics and over 100 students, the Brazilian combustion community is very active in different fundamental and applied areas, including fire safety science. The RNC has a strong organizing capability which include 9 Combustion Summer Schools and several large conferences, like the International Congress on Mechanical Engineering (COBEM), and several conferences organized by the International Centre for Heat and Mass Transfer (ICHMT).

Conference Venue and accommodations

Venue

The main campus of Universidad Técnica Federico Santa María would be used as venue for hosting the IAFSS symposium. Note that the University has graciously offered its facilities free of charge for the realization of the symposium. The USM campus is located at a 10 min drive away from the Viña del Mar city center where most hotels and restaurants are located. The organizing committee of the symposium will explore the option of providing private transportation for the attendees to streamline the shuttle between the hotels and the conference venue. The committee will also evaluate the option of having a point-of-contact at the airport to facilitate transportation to Viña del Mar.

At the university there are multiple areas available to carry out workshops and parallel sessions in full flexibility, as well as an exhibition hall that can be dedicated to the poster presentations and coffee breaks. The university's main hall or aula magna is one of the main cultural stages in the country and will be used for the plenary sessions during the symposium. The aula magna has a capacity of 1,239 people, distributed in two different levels, and has all the required capabilities in terms of audio, illumination, imaging systems, and universal accessibility in place.



The USM has extensive in-house capabilities to create and maintain a symposium website with online registrations and payment features. Furthermore, the USM campus also provides all the facilities required to organize the 16th version of the symposium in a hybrid version. After the COVID-19 pandemic, all Chilean Universities were forced to implement systems to perform virtual and hybrid teaching activities. These systems remain in place and will facilitate the execution of the symposium in a hybrid format if necessary.




Sustainability, diversity, and inclusion

San Pedro de Atacama the heart of the desert

It has maintained the characteristics of an authentic village, with dirt-track streets and houses made of straw and clay, immersed in the middle of the powerful desert landscape.

Located at the foot of the immense Licancabur Volcano, San Pedro is the land of the indigenous people, the atacameños or kunzas — an ancient culture which developed long before the Spanish arrived. At the Ruins of Quitor and Catarpe, there are several impressive relics belonging to their rich culture. Visitors can delve deeper into the subject by visiting the R. P. Gustavo Le Paige Archaeological Museum, where there's a stock of mummies and everyday objects.




