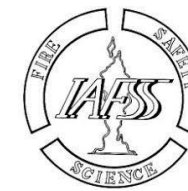


Why is my paper getting rejected?

Four editors of the most known journals in the fire safety field publishing papers in human behaviour in fire will present the most common reasons for rejecting papers in the journals they are editors for. In the second part of the webinar, the attendees will have the opportunity to ask questions to the editors about the editorial process in their journals and get more information on how to improve manuscripts in the Human Behaviour in Fire domain.

Dr Karen Boyce is a Senior Lecturer at Ulster University (UK) and the editor of the last Special Issue in Human Behaviour in Fire in the journal Fire & Materials (edited by Wiley)

Dr Enrico Ronchi is an Associate Professor at Lund University (Sweden) and Associate Editor for Safety Science (edited by Elsevier) and Fire Technology (edited by Springer)
